Tips on how to to share your testimony with UNESCO

Questions for teachers (please say your first name, the grade you teach, city and country)

- How do you feel about not being at school?
- What do you miss the most about your students?
- How are you helping your students keep up with their lessons?
- What do you want to say to the people who are watching this video?
- Share your top three tips with other teachers who are trying to teach their students at home.

Questions for parents (please say your first name, city and country)

- How are you feel about your child/children not being able to go school?
- How are you helping your child keep up with lessons?
- What do you want to say to the people who are watching this video?
- Share your top three tips with other parents who are trying to teach their children at home.

Tips for recording your video (60 seconds maximum)

1. Record in a well-lighted place, making sure the person who's going to speak isn't in the shade.
2. Test the sound. Film for a few seconds and listen to the video to make sure the sound was good. If it isn't, get closer to the person. Make sure there are no noises around you or other people speaking at the same time.
3. The video will be cut to a square (1:1) format. Whether you film horizontal or vertical, make sure that the person is always in the center of your frame.
4. Ask the person to repeat the question as she/he starts answering your question so that the viewers will know what she/he is going to be talking about right away.
